KEYNOTE SPEAKER Jennifer Gerz-Escandón

ince 2021, Dr. Jennifer Gerz-Escandón has served as Associate Vice President for Academic Programs and Research at the University of North Carolina (UNC) System Office. Within the Academic Affairs Division, Dr. Gerz-Escandón leads the implementation of UNC Board of Governors policies on graduate academic program planning and approval and manages two systemwide research initiatives: the Research Opportunities Initiative and the Undergraduate Research Program Award. Her core responsibilities also involve managing annual sponsored programs and research reporting for the \$2B UNC System research enterprise and supporting key UNC System affinity groups including the Chief Research Officers, the Graduate Council, and the Undergraduate **Research Council.**

Prior to joining the UNC System Office, Gerz-Escandón was associate dean for Interdisciplinary Education and Fellowship Programs in The Graduate School at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. In The Graduate School, she was responsible for developing budgets, implementing funding policies, and leading faculty review panels for more than a dozen master's and doctoral research fellowship and award programs. In addition to serving as chair of the Fellowship Committee of The Graduate School Administrative Board, Gerz-Escandón oversaw interdisciplinary education and professional development activities.

During her nearly 20 years in higher education, Gerz-Escandón has held administrative and faculty roles at public and private universities. Starting her career as a visiting assistant professor in the Political Science Department at the University of Evansville in Indiana, she was soon offered and accepted a tenure track position, and subsequently appointed director of International Studies. At Lynn University in Florida, she served as chair and associate professor in the International Relations Program, and, later, director of the Center for International Programs and Services. As a visiting faculty member at universities in Japan and the United Kingdom, she enjoyed teaching interdisciplinary courses and was recognized by Lynn University students as Teacher of the Year. Currently, Dr. Gerz-Escandón is an adjunct faculty teaching in the

graduate program on Higher Education Administration at North Carolina Central University.

More recently, as director of National Scholarships and Fellowships for the Honors College at Georgia State University, she focused on expanding access to undergraduate research experiences by supporting the Undergraduate STEM Research Society. Gerz-Escandón is the recipient of a Fulbright International Education Administrator grant to Germany and a German Academic Exchange Service grant. She is honored to have served as a national reviewer for the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute graduate and public policy fellowships and the Asian and Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund. In 2020, she was selected as an IAspire Leadership Academy Fellow – a National Science Foundation-funded, APLU-led initiative.

Gerz-Escandón holds a bachelor's degree in government from Georgetown University, a

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diploma in international relations from University of the West Indies, and a master's degree and doctorate in international relations from the University of Miami.
